

Barbados' maritime claim




Outline map of the Eastern Caribbean region






Potential extent of outer continental shelf in Atlantic sector (taken from Barbados Letter of 6 September 2004, Map 1)






The boundary between the Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea (Source: Limits of Oceans and Seas, International Hydrographic Organization, 1953)






The Caribbean and Atlantic sectors within the area of overlapping EEZ entitlements






Trinidad and Tobago's archipelagic baselines






Barbados' south facing coast






Opposite and adjacent coastal frontages






Barbados' maritime claim





Construction of the equidistance line and proposed turning point




The Dominica-France maritime boundary






Trinidad and Tobago EEZ claim line in relation to the area of overlapping entitlements






The relationship between continental shelf and EEZ rights




