#### **Hearing on the Merits and Damages**

The hearing on the merits and damages in the arbitration between Resolute Forest Products Inc. and the Government of Canada will be held from Monday, November 9, 2020 to Saturday, November 14, 2020. The arbitral proceedings are being conducted pursuant to Chapter Eleven of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

The hearing will be held by videoconference. The opening and closing statements of the Disputing Parties, scheduled to be held on November 9, 2020 and November 14, 2020, respectively, from 8:00am EST (Eastern Standard Time) to 2:30pm EST will be transmitted to the public via live-feed. # **Background of the Dispute**

Pursuant to Article 1120 of NAFTA and the 1976 UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules, through a Notice of Arbitration dated December 30, 2015, Resolute Forest Products Inc., on its own behalf and on behalf of its subsidiary, Resolute FP Canada Inc., instituted arbitral proceedings against the Government of Canada. The Tribunal is composed of Judge James R. Crawford AC (President); Dean Ronald A. Cass and Professor Céline Lévesque. The Permanent Court of Arbitration acts as Registry in this arbitration.

The PCA's International Bureau is currently administering 7 inter-State disputes, 102 investor-State arbitrations, 52 cases arising under contracts involving a State or other public entity, and 2 other disputes.
