- 1. My name is Lucas McCall. I am a Deputy Director in the Asia Trade Policy and Negotiation Division at Global Affairs Canada ("GAC").
- 2. From November 2010 until August 2017, I was with the Investment Trade Policy Division at GAC, serving as Trade Policy Officer from November 2010 to June 2013 and Senior Trade Policy Officer from June 2013 to August 2017. My responsibilities included providing trade policy advice on NAFTA Chapter Eleven cases, including the *Mesa Power LLC v. Canada* NAFTA Chapter Eleven arbitration ("*Mesa* arbitration").
- 3. As part of my role working on the *Mesa* arbitration, I was tasked with ensuring that the GAC website page maintained for the purposes of the *Mesa* arbitration was up to date with all submissions filed in the arbitration. I can confirm that, as of May 8, 2013, the following submissions in the *Mesa* arbitration were publicly available on that website:
  - Notice of Intent to Submit a Claim to Arbitration
  - Notice of Arbitration
  - Government of Canada Outline of Potential Issues
  - Government of Canada Objection to Jurisdiction

5. I can also confirm that, as of September 11, 2013, in addition to the documents listed in paragraph 3, the following documents were publicly available on the GAC website page maintained for the purposes of the *Mesa* arbitration:

6. Attached as Exhibit R-030 is a true and correct copy of a version history screenshot of the *Mesa* arbitration page of the GAC website as of September 11, 2013.<sup>2</sup>

7. From January 4, 2016 onward, GAC's practice was not to post submissions from NAFTA Chapter Eleven proceedings on the GAC website. Instead, to ensure Canada's transparency obligations under the NAFTA were met, GAC website pages maintained for NAFTA Chapter Eleven arbitrations directed visitors to the website of the relevant administering institution. As a result, from January 4, 2016 onward, the GAC webpage maintained for the *Mesa* arbitration directed visitors to the website of the Permanent Court of Arbitration.<sup>3</sup>
