Re: Dispute Under Stock Transfer Agreement Dated October 23, 1997

Concerning Third Party Liability Claims

Dear Sirs:

We write on behalf of our clients, The Renco Group, Inc. ("Renco"), and Doe Run Resources Corporation, to invite Activos Mineros and The Republic of Peru to participate in the non-binding expert process established by Clauses 5.3(A) and 5.4(C) of the Stock Transfer Agreement dated October 23, 1997, by and between Empresa Minera del Centro del Peru S.A. ("Centromin") and Doe Run Peru, Doe Run Resources and Renco (the "STA"); and the Guaranty Agreement by which the Republic of Peru guaranteed the obligations of Centromin (the "Guaranty"), concerning damages and claims alleged by third-party Peruvian citizens arising from environmental contamination in and around the mining complex in La Oroya, Peru (the "Complex"). Activos Mineros subsequently assumed Centromin's obligations under the STA.

Specifically, a group of plaintiffs residing in La Oroya, Peru, has filed lawsuits in St. Louis, Missouri, U.S.A., asserting various personal injury claims relating to alleged lead exposure and environmental contamination from the Complex. Additional groups of Peruvian citizens filed similar claims in St. Louis over the ensuing years. As of this date, the number of Peruvian plaintiffs in the St. Louis lawsuits totals over 1,900. The individuals combined claims are far in excess of US \$50,000.00.

Through various and numerous letters, Renco and its affiliates advised Activos Mineros and the Republic of Peru of the third party claims pending in St. Louis, and requested that Activos Mineros and the Republic of Peru honor their various obligations under the STA with respect to these third party claims, including but not limited to the obligations set forth in Clauses 5.3, 5.4, 6.2, 6.3, 6.5, 8.14, and 12, as well as under Peruvian law. Activos Mineros responded by letters dated November 5, 2010 and November 26, 2010 denying any responsibility for the third-party litigation claims. Peru did not respond.

It is unclear whether engaging in the non-binding expert process in advance of international arbitration under the Stock Transfer Agreement with respect to these third-party personal injury claims would be productive at this juncture. Nevertheless, if Activos Mineros and the Republic of Peru accept this invitation to participate in the non-binding expert process, Renco and Doe Run Resources propose James A. Bruen as the neutral expert. A copy of Mr. James A. Bruen's curriculum vitae is attached.

We respectfully request a prompt response to this invitation.
